a. Streetlights/Fire Hydrants - Tom Mize

Streetlights / Fire Protection:

•Members discussed installing streetlights at the intersections of US 41 and W. CitrusSpring Blvd and US 41 and G. Martinelli Blvd. for safety purposes.

•The energy service provider will have to make an assessment to determine the estimated construction cost of new poles, feed, or transformers that may be needed.

•**Thomas Mize made motion to install streetlights at the intersections of W.Citrus Springs Blvd. and US 41 and West side of G. Martinelli Blvd and US41.**

•**Seconded by Edwin Roberts.**

- Motion approved unanimously.

- The streetlight on Citrus Springs Blvd and N. Florida Ave. by the fountain area has been fixed

b. Road Resurfacing - Edwin Roberts

Road Resurfacing:

- D.A.B defaulted on their contract they had with the County and state agencies. The County has been in communication with the Surety Company who have assigned a takeover agreement with a local company to finish out the contract. The agreement needs to be worked through with everyone in agreement of the monetary impact and that it meets legal specifications. Once settled out and approved by the BOCC, paving will resume.
- After the next BOCC meeting, Mr. Brock will provide the 2022 resurfacing list for Mr. Roberts.
- Empire Construction has a large sign in the right of way at the end of N. Creek Way and W. Country Club Blvd. that is obstructing the view for motorists. Mr. Brock will investigate this safety concern.
- Mr. Mize inquired if Deltona Blvd. and 491 is on SCOP resurfacing list. A portion of Deltona Blvd. is on the SCOP project. Mr. Brock will verify.

c. Beautification of Boulevards/Medians/Flowers-Pam Williamson

- Anna Miele recommended red and white Pansies, but the grower cannot produce viable plants during the warm weather. As an alternate, the Board discussed planting Petunias, which was planted last year.

- Thomas Mize made motion to approve the winter planting of red and white Petunias.

- Seconded by Louise Bono.

- Motion approved unanimously.

d. Grate Installation/Fountain-Joan Dias

- Grate installations have been completed for the fiscal year.

e. Roadway Maintenance/Mowing-Louise Bono

Roadway Maintenance / Mowing:

- No issues reported with mowing. Mrs. Bono commented that the roadways look good.
- Mrs. Dias commented that the fountain looks great. The monument at 39 and N. Citrus Springs Blvd. has been fixed.
