V. READING AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes from **October 26, 2021** previously submitted via email had minor edits under Library Staff attending meeting. Susan Mutschler was removed; Debbie Reilly and Adam Chang were added. Amended copies were distributed during the meeting for approval. Ken presented motion to accept minutes, Phyllis second. All in favor. **Minutes approved.**

VI. OPEN TO THE PUBLIC**1. Council Member / Inverness**

David Ryan – Invited all to the Christmas Parade on Saturday, December 11, 2021. He expressed appreciation and support for all LAB members do for the Library.

2. Expressions from the Public

- a) **John Labriola** – Citrus County resident, addressed the Board seeking a response to questions regarding LGBTQ displays and other issues. He asked if there is a plan to present an ideological display in June of 2022.
- b) **Dr. Paul J. Reinhardt** – Introduced himself as a candidate running for Florida House Dist. 34; discussed concerns about ideological displays at the Library.
- c) **Tracy Edgmon** – Citrus County resident; made appearance before the board with concerns about ideological displays at the Library and recommended a month of education about human and sex trafficking, and abuse of children.
- d) **Billy Casey** – Citrus Springs resident; made appearance before the board with concerns about lifestyle displays at the Library.
- e) **June Pressley** – Retired teacher; made appearance before the board and requested to follow policies as the School District when referring to minors and sexuality.
- f) **Sandy Price** – President of FOCCLS; made appearance before the board in support of the library and their staff.
- g) **Judy Rose** – Citrus County resident made appearance before the board in support of the Library.
- h) **Gay Courter** – Former Guardian ad Litem for Citrus County; made appearance before the board and shared her experience representing abused children and noted her support of the Library.

3. Update/Comments from the Chair

Chairwoman April McLaughlin expressed her interest in clarifying any wrong impressions about the LAB Board and its mission. She then read the following statement as Chairperson:

LAB works as an advisory board to the County Commissioners and oversees foundation funds deposited into the US Family Foundation; those funds are for the betterment of the Citrus County Library System that serves the entire Citrus County community.

There was someone that brought up myself and I have been cast in a certain light by individuals on record at the County Commissioner meeting and at the Library Advisory Board meeting. I stood up in front of Citrus County citizens at a meeting and discussed the proposal of the NY Times and stated my objection to that subscription and weighed in and gave my statement before the Commissioners stating that I was not in support of the digital subscription proposal and why I was opposed to it.

The Library Advisory Board members are not appointed because of any specific political ideology. Our love for literacy and the concerns, dedication to the libraries are the overriding factors in consideration for appointment to the LAB. Diversity of thought and ideology are important as that represents who we are in the Citrus County area and at the Citrus County Library System. Content of displays at libraries are comparable to practice and displays at many libraries in Florida and around the country. The same standards, bookshelves and display areas are used for numerous displays related to various types of events throughout the year. Some of these events include: Black History Month, Women's Suffrage, 9/11 Memorial, 4th of July, Flag Day, Constitution Week, Banned Book Week, D-Day, Veterans Day, Daughters of the American Revolution, Library Literary Awards, and Best Sellers.

The Library Advisory Board itself supports the library staff, Eric Head -the Library Director, and FOCCLS (Friends of the Library). The LAB has made sure that various opinions and ideas are heard in all our meetings. That's important. The Library System has a responsibility to make sure that various opinions and ideas are represented through materials available in our Library System. That's important. Both strive to respect all ideas and opinions even if they differ from our own and as the First Amendment guides us there.

The Library Advisory Board has work to do in support of our libraries and our communities, and we need to return to our work. I would like to thank the Library Advisory Board members, every single one of them, for their continued work and support of our libraries and community.

VIII. REGULAR BUSINESS**A. Director's Report**

Presented by Library Director Eric Head

1. LAB Members Terms

There are nine members on the board and five (5) expirations are coming due in the month of January. Some joined the board in the middle of rotation. They will need to reapply and they will need to be reappointed, *Shavonna Reid* and *Carol Spring*.

Public is welcomed to apply directly to the Library Director or to the County Administration Denise Gallagher by submitting their application along with resume and/or letter. The applications are available through the website and they remain active for a year. Applications will be presented during the next BOCC meeting on February 8, 2022.

2. Staffing Updates

Staffing overview: The Library System used to have six (6) branches, but in 1995 it dropdown to five (5). Since 2011, library reduced staffing from 64 positions to 49 positions by 2012, 13 of them are part time. We are currently managing five libraries, six-days a week. Technology was modified to assist in the administration.

- a) **Region Manager:** *Susan Mutschler* accepted a job out of state. The position was posted. *Adam Chang* was promoted to Region Manager effective December 25, 2021. He will oversee Lakes Region and Homosassa branches. *Debbie Reilly* will remain over Central Ridge and Floral City, and will add Coastal Region.
- b) **Branch Supervisor:** *TerriAnne Caraluzzo* is retiring this month (December) and with *Adam Chang's* promotion to Region Manager it created two (2) Branch Supervisor's openings.
- c) **Library Assistant:** *Hanna Sigler* is a new Library Assistant at Floral City.
- d) **Library Aides:** New Library Aides since the last meeting, *Kirstie Weaver* and *Yaneth Crim* at Coastal Region, and *Savannah Rennison* and *Kelly Tremblay* at Central Ridge.

- e) **Accounting Clerk:** *Linda Maughan* decided to shift to a part time position at another County division (Support Services). The new Accounting Clerk is *Michele Stewart* who started this week.

3. Annual Statistics

Copies of the Annual Statistics were distributed and topics discussed. It was added that Annual Statistics are submitted to the State to qualify for grants. Some highlights discussed included:

- 100,000+ Digital Circulation
- Over 57,000 Library Cards Holders
- 5,000 – 6,000 New Registrations per year on average
- 2,225,440 Website Views
- 28,248 Wi-Fi Connections
- 258,418 Library Visitors
- 1,768 Programs
- 12,781 Volunteers Hours

4. Friends Presidents

Friends presidents from all five branches and FOCCLS president informally met with Library Director and discussed support between the groups, the umbrella group FOCCLS, and amazing success through the book sales. Approximately \$31,456 was raised during the last FOCCS book sale. Homosassa also raised almost \$7,000 this year. We are thankful for their support!

5. Grants

Thanks to FOCCLS Sandy Price, the library was able to obtain a \$10K grant for children literacy AWE workstations that will be installed at Lakes Region and Central Ridge libraries with children's software that includes literacy materials.

6. Thank You

Eric Head commended volunteers and staff for their hard work striving to do their best guiding the libraries to years of success.

B. Library Public Relations Update

Presented by Communications Facilitator Taylor Keeran

1. **Reading Tree:** Reading Tree will kick off on February 1, 2022. In 2021, we raised over \$12,000 in donations, able to purchase over 700 books –adult and juvenile fiction and non-fiction books and they were added to our library collection.

2. **YouTube Channel:** Lakes Region Library Summer Reading story, *Three Billy Goats Gruff*, read by *Youth Librarian Amiee Marshall* has got above 28K views. Central Ridge Library story, *Hilda the Hippo*, read by *Youth Librarian Kim Roberts*, has got more than 9K views. A series of holiday stories that will air this month will present stories for Hanukkah, Christmas, and Kwanza.
3. **Toys for Tots:** *Toys for Tots Coordinator Paul Pilny* contacted *Central Ridge Branch Supervisor Danielle Doty*. They received 1,700 donated books that will be distributed for Christmas. Four (4) schools were selected. *Debbie Reilly* and *Taylor Keeran* already distributed approximately 400 books at Lecanto Primary School.
4. **High School Program Scholarships:** *Adult Literacy Librarian April Frazier* is managing the ten (10) scholarships to Career Online High School, for residents of Citrus County that do not have a high school diploma or GED. Interviews for the scholarship are lined up. Those selected will be able to attend online, get a tutor and obtain their High School Diploma.
5. **Online Newsletter for Parents:** The newsletter is a monthly reminder sent via email with news about events for children. Newsletters are sent out the last Monday of each month.
6. **Holiday Open House:** Each library is holding a Holiday Open House with music, snacks, activities and craft. Today is at Central Ridge.
7. **Christmas Trees:** Friends of the Central Ridge, Coastal Region and Lakes Region donate funds to Key Training Center. KTC delivers a Christmas tree to the branch and decorates them every year. Floral City has a beautiful small tree decorated by staff and Friends.
8. **Noon-Year's Eve Celebration:** Youth Program for children celebrate "Noon Year" at each branch with many activities on December 31st.
9. **Library Card Signup Month:** We sent out 2,100 library card applications to public and private local schools and 750 were filled.
10. **Parks & Recreation Youth Expo:** January 8th will be the next outreach event. Sports related books will be displayed.
11. **Crystal River Manatee Festival:** Outreach including StoryWalk Citrus on January 15th and 16th
12. **Floral City Strawberry Festival:** Outreach including StoryWalk Citrus in March.
13. **Santa for Seniors:** Home Instead mini trees are available for those that wish to donated for seniors. In the past, we have had over 600 bulbs of gift wish.

Dear Citrus County Commission and administration,

I am writing you as a Citrus County homeowner concerned about the use of the taxpayer-funded county library system to promote the political messages of the LGBT movement.

When visiting the Lakes Region branch library today in Inverness, I couldn't help noticing the big "Gay Pride Month" book display that greets visitors at the entrance as soon as they walk into the library. (See photo attached.) The display features various political slogans of the LGBT movement and a large selection of books promoting the celebration of homosexuality and transgenderism, along with rainbow colored "Pride" bookmarks that patrons of all ages are encouraged to take.

Does the County Commission feel it's appropriate to use its taxpayers' dollars to promote a sexualized political agenda that many parents and residents strongly object to on religious and moral grounds, especially in a library setting where impressionable children will be exposed to it?

Does the library system give equal time and promotion to opposing political messages, such as pro-life book displays and messages during Respect Life Month in October? Or do only leftist and cultural Marxist messages receive the county's support?

I would appreciate a reply as I will be sharing this information with my church community in the absence of a satisfactory response.

Mr. Labriola,

I'm responding to your recent inquiry regarding Pride month displays at the Lakes and Coastal Region Libraries. Book displays are created throughout the year at all branch locations. Our libraries present hundreds of these displays annually. Generally, the size and frequency of displays can vary depending on the level of interest as well as the volume of material published and available on any given topic.

The content of the displays is determined by various staff and is approved as part of a quarterly planning process with multiple library professionals including supervisors, managers, and the library director. Display topics are chosen and prioritized based on a number of factors including popularity, demand, general interest, current events, and topics that are broadly recognized at a local, state, or national level. While subject matter may overlap with political themes or issues, displays are never chosen based on political ideology. Additionally, as with all the materials on the shelves, displays and exhibits in library facilities do not imply endorsement of the content.

Library staff value ethical conduct, professionalism, and target their activity to achieve the highest professional standards. We make every attempt to incorporate a multitude of viewpoints throughout the year based on the criteria stated above and prioritize in accordance with the principles of intellectual freedom and upholding the first amendment rights of all individuals.

Our current policy for displays states that the library provides space for public displays and exhibits that direct attention to the materials and services of the library, promotes the pursuit of knowledge and education to the community, provides exposure to the work of authors and artists and provides information on subjects of general interest. Often, displays at the library incorporate current events or coordinate with specific nationally recognized topics such as Black History Month, Women's Suffrage, Pride, etc. We also display for Flag Day, Constitution Week, Banned Books Week, and many others.

At all libraries it is important to respect the diversity of our library users, library workers, and members of the communities in which we serve. The month of June is Pride month and recognized nationally by the American Library Association, and statewide by the Florida Library Association. Our libraries join thousands of public libraries nationwide in the standard practice of presenting displays related to this subject material, both fiction and non-fiction, as well as highlighting award winning books and authors of significance. The displays are topical and aligned with current events, as in all previous years.

We appreciate all inquiries into our library programs and services, and respect the viewpoints and opinions of everyone.

Thank you Mr. Head. Attached is my completed Reconsideration Request form. Due to the apparent confusion caused by the memo included in the Jan. 4 county commission package, which seemed to imply that previous complaints by myself and others regarding the LGBT library displays were not submitted on the proper form (which was never previously mentioned or provided), I am resubmitting my earlier complaint (which was originally emailed to you on June 7) on the form which you provided me yesterday.

As a reminder, following your June 11 email reply to me in which you defended the displays, we brought this issue to the Library Advisory Board's attention at their last three meetings on Sept. 7, Oct. 26 and finally on Dec. 9, when the chairwoman read a statement dismissing our concerns and indicating the LGBT displays would continue. But based on comments made by some commissioners at the Jan. 4 commission meeting, it appears that the majority of the commission voted against changing policy regarding displays because your memo gave them the impression that the complaint procedure was not followed through to completion at the administrative and Library Advisory Board levels before being appealed to the county commission for resolution. Therefore, I am starting over at square one on behalf of the many citizens who complained in order to satisfy the concerns of those commissioners who said they did not want the LGBT displays in the libraries but preferred that the complaint go through the citizen complaint process before being brought to the commission for final resolution, even though we feel we already completed this administrative process once without a satisfactory resolution.

Please acknowledge receipt, and please place this issue on the next agenda of the Library Advisory Board in accordance with the procedure outlined in your Jan. 4 commission agenda memo.

The displays in the Lakes and Coastal Region libraries featured rainbow flags and political slogans of the LGBT movement and a large selection of books promoting the celebration of homosexuality and gender dysphoria, along with "Pride" bookmarks that patrons of all ages were encouraged to take. At a time when more and more books are coming out about the irreversible damage and lifelong regret caused by transgender indoctrination, puberty blockers and sexual mutilation surgeries on children, our tax dollars should not be supporting one-sided celebrations of this evil ideology.

2. Did you find there to be anything positive about the material? Please note specific elements and references, and include page numbers, disc numbers, if possible.

No. These displays violate community standards, endanger children and force taxpayers to subsidize highly inappropriate political/sexual propaganda, as stated above. The displays are a clear form of advocacy on behalf of the LGBT movement, not only through the selection of books with an exclusively one-sided message, but through the inclusion of slogans of the LGBT movement like "Happy Pride Month," "Love is Love" and "Live Good Be True" that put an intentionally positive spin on sexual deviancy and are intended to celebrate same-sex marriage and gender dysphoria.

3. Do you have a recommendation of another similar and comparable resource that could make a quality replacement? If so, please list.

The LGBT propaganda displays should not be in the libraries at all. Any display on homosexuality or transgenderism, if one were ever to take place, should focus on the dangers of these lifestyles, which lead to disease, depression, drug abuse and irreversible medical damage. But these displays were a completely one-sided celebration of the LGBT lifestyle and did not include any warning messages or books such as "Irreversible Damage" by Abigail Shrier or "The Health Hazards of Homosexuality" published by Mass Resistance, which document the dangers of LGBT ideology.

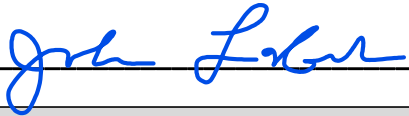
